Fernley Animal Control Update

While we have all enjoyed taking our furry friends on car rides, it is that time where it is too hot to leave Fido in the car while shopping. The average temperature of a dog is 102°F and being contained in a hot vehicle can become a medical emergency. Did you know that the temperature of a parked car in 70°F weather can quickly climb to a dangerous temperature for an animal? Just think if it's 100°F outside! Check out the informative chart below for reference. Contrary to popular belief, cracking the windows does little to help relieve the temperature in a car.

If you see a pet locked in a hot car, please contact Animal Control at 775-784-9803 or the Lyon County Dispatch at 775-463-6600 and describe the make, model, pet(s), and license plate if available. Please do not take any action yourself, unless the pet is suffering from an immediate medical emergency and contact Animal Control right away.

Animal Control takes dogs in hot cars very seriously and citations will be issued to owners. Those convicted of leaving a dog in a hot car during dangerous temperatures may have to pay a fine of up to \$1,000. While 5-minutes in the store may not seem like a long time, for a pet stuck in a hot car, it could be an eternity. Please help to keep your pet safe this summer and leave them home with the air conditioning while the outside temperature is hot, Fido will thank you!

HOW LONG BEFORE YOUR CAR IS HOT ENOUGH TO KILL?

IF YOU LOVE THEM, LEAVE THEM AT HOME.

Just 15 minutes can be enough for a pet's body temperature to climb from a normal 102.5 to deadly levels that will damage the nervous and cardiovascular systems, often leaving the animal comatose, dehydrated and at risk of permanent impairment or death.
